SERMON TEXT Genesis 13

¹ So Abram went up from Egypt, he and his wife and all that he had, and Lot with him, into the Negeb. ² Now Abram was very rich in livestock, in silver, and in gold. ³ And he journeyed on from the Negeb as far as Bethel to the place where his tent had been at the beginning, between Bethel and Ai, ⁴ to the place where he had made an altar at the first. And there Abram called upon the name of the LORD. ⁵ And Lot, who went with Abram, also had flocks and herds and tents, ⁶ so that the land could not support both of them dwelling together; for their possessions were so great that they could not dwell together, ⁷ and there was strife between the herdsmen of Abram's livestock and the herdsmen of Lot's livestock. At that time the Canaanites and the Perizzites were dwelling in the land.

⁸ Then Abram said to Lot, "Let there be no strife between you and me, and between your herdsmen and my herdsmen, for we are kinsmen. ⁹ Is not the whole land before you? Separate yourself from me. If you take the left hand, then I will go to the left." ¹⁰ And Lot lifted up his eyes and saw that the Jordan Valley was well watered everywhere like the garden of the LORD, like the land of Egypt, in the direction of Zoar. (This was before the LORD destroyed Sodom and Gomorrah.) ¹¹ So Lot chose for himself all the Jordan Valley, and Lot journeyed east. Thus they separated from each other. ¹² Abram settled in the land of Canaan, while Lot settled among the cities of the valley and moved his tent as far as Sodom. ¹³ Now the men of Sodom were wicked, great sinners against the LORD.

¹⁴ The LORD said to Abram, after Lot had separated from him, "Lift up your eyes and look from the place where you are, northward and southward and eastward and westward, ¹⁵ for all the land that you see I will give to you and to your offspring forever. ¹⁶ I will make your offspring as the dust of the earth, so that if one can count the dust of the earth, your offspring also can be counted. ¹⁷ Arise, walk through the length and the breadth of the land, for I will give it to you." ¹⁸ So Abram moved his tent and came and settled by the oaks of Mamre, which are at Hebron, and there he built an altar to the LORD.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

MAIN POINT

The big idea of this sermon/text is that a life of faith is wise and good for us, and it brings glory to God. In particular we see here the unique glory God gets when his people act in faith during conflict.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What were your thoughts on the text/sermon? What most stood out? How was it helpful? Confusing?
- 2. Which is easier for you to see: 1) The folly of taking matters into your own hands, or 2) The glory of leaving matters in God's hands? Why do you think that is? How have you experienced each in your life?
- 3. Do you find comfort in the fact that Abram repeatedly took matters into his own hands and left them in God's?
- 4. What percent of the questions you'd like to know from God are answered in the Bible? What do you think it means that many of your questions aren't answered? What do you do when your questions aren't answered?
- 5. What is the greatest source of conflict in your life? How does conflict usually play out? What do you learn from the way Abram handled his conflict with Lot? Can you name one specific way your conflict would be different if you were to live by faith in a greater way?
- 6. How have you experienced the truthfulness of the statement, "Things aren't always as they seem"?
- 7. In what ways does this passage bring you hope?

AREAS OF APPLICATION

- 8. Do your best to identify one area in which you have taken matters into your own hands and make a specific plan to put it back in God's. Ask someone to pray for you in this and hold you accountable.
- 9. Choose one area of regular conflict in your life and figure out a way to engage it with a new faith in God's promises. Figure out how you can avoid it if possible, where you might be able to give up your "rights" or freedoms to preserve love and unity, and/or trust in God to be the ultimate arbiter.
- 10. Tell someone else of the judgment ofGod that rests upon all who do not believe. Help them to see the seriousness of their predicament and the glory of God's rescue plan.
- 11. Name one specific thing that you mean to do differently by the power of the Holy Spirit.

PRAYER POINTS

- 12. Confess any sins that God brings to mind concerning taking matters into your own hands, judging (like Lot) on sight, or engaging conflict in a faithless way. Thank Him for the forgiveness that is yours in Jesus.
- 13. Worship God for one specific aspect of His character that is revealed in this passage.
- 14. Ask God to make you a peacemaker, fill you with trust in His promises, and be a blessing to the world around you.
- 15. Pray for one specific person in your life to come to know Jesus. Pray for one other specific person to grow in their faith in Jesus.
