SERMON TEXT Genesis 18:16-33

Then the men set out from there, and they looked down toward Sodom. And Abraham went with them to set them on their way. ¹⁷ The LORD said, "Shall I hide from Abraham what I am about to do, ¹⁸ seeing that Abraham shall surely become a great and mighty nation, and all the nations of the earth shall be blessed in him? ¹⁹ For I have chosen him, that he may command his children and his household after him to keep the way of the LORD by doing righteousness and justice, so that the LORD may bring to Abraham what he has promised him." ²⁰ Then the LORD said, "Because the outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is great and their sin is very grave, ²¹ I will go down to see whether they have done altogether according to the outcry that has come to me. And if not, I will know."

²² So the men turned from there and went toward Sodom, but Abraham still stood before the LORD. ²³ Then Abraham drew near and said, "Will you indeed sweep away the righteous with the wicked? ²⁴ Suppose there are fifty righteous within the city. Will you then sweep away the place and not spare it for the fifty righteous who are in it? ²⁵ Far be it from you to do such a thing, to put the righteous to death with the wicked, so that the righteous fare as the wicked! Far be that from you! Shall not the Judge of all the earth do what is just?" ²⁶ And the LORD said, "If I find at Sodom fifty righteous in the city, I will spare the whole place for their sake."

²⁷ Abraham answered and said, "Behold, I have undertaken to speak to the Lord, I who am but dust and ashes. ²⁸ Suppose five of the fifty righteous are lacking. Will you destroy the whole city for lack of five?" And he said, "I will not destroy it if I find forty-five there." ²⁹ Again he spoke to him and said, "Suppose forty are found there." He answered, "For the sake of forty I will not do it." ³⁰ Then he said, "Oh let not the Lord be angry, and I will speak. Suppose thirty are found there." He answered, "I will not do it, if I find thirty there." ³¹ He said, "Behold, I have undertaken to speak to the Lord. Suppose twenty are found there." He answered, "For the sake of twenty I will not destroy it." ³² Then he said, "Oh let not the Lord be angry, and I will speak again but this once. Suppose ten are found there." He answered, "For the sake of ten I will not destroy it." ³³ And the LORD went his way, when he had finished speaking to Abraham, and Abraham returned to his place.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

MAIN POINT

The main point of this passage is that God's judgment is always just. Let's pray that God would help us to see His perfect holiness, our sinfulness, and the just judgment that flows from the mingling of those two things. Let's pray also that God would freshly impress us with His patience, mercy, and grace for those who hope in Him.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What were your thoughts on the text/sermon? What most stood out? How was it helpful? Confusing?
- 2. How bad does someone need to be before it's fair for God to send them to hell? How do you know that?
- 3. Has it ever seemed to you that God acted unfairly? Talk about that situation. Do you see it the same way today?
- 4. Have you ever considered Genesis 18:17-19 as a window into the thought process of God? What's your reaction to this? What's your reaction to the fact that God contemplates His actions toward you like that?
- 5. Does the reality that God chose you before you chose Him bring you comfort or frustration? Why?
- 6. Is it easy for you to see all of your blessings as means of blessing others?
- 7. Did your parents work to impart justice and righteousness to you? Do you see that as your role to your kids?
- 8. Are there any areas of your life in which you believed yourself to be righteous only to find out later that you weren't? How does that shape your view of your righteousness today?
- 9. What do you think about the fact that if God were fair to you, you'd be in hell? Does that knowledge shape the way you feel toward or treat others?

AREAS OF APPLICATION

- 10. Identify one area in which you could help build a culture of justice in your family, home, or community. Similarly, find a way to grow in and promote righteousness. Find someone to partner with in these things.
- 11. For a second week, commit to showing gospel-hospitality to someone this week.
- 12. Pick three specific ways to turn your abundance into a blessing for someone else this week.
- 13. Kids, ask your parents to help you "keep the way of the LORD by doing righteousness and justice."
- 14. Come to one of Grace's corporate prayer times this week. Make a prayer list for each day of this coming week.
- 15. Name one specific thing that you mean to do differently by the power of the Holy Spirit.

PRAYER POINTS

- 16. Adoration. Praise God for His perfect justice. Worship Him for being both just and justifier in Jesus!
- 17. Confession. Confess your lack of hospitality, justice, righteousness, and heart for the lost.
- 18. Thanksgiving. Thank God for holding back so much evil in this world. Thank Him for revealing His mind and promises to us. Thank Him for making you righteous in Jesus.
- 19. Supplication. Ask God to bring justice to the oppressed; especially the oppressed Christians around the world. Ask God to help our church grow in our understanding of His mind, in order that we'd better be able to do His will. Ask God to be merciful to the unbelievers in your life. Ask God to help you see where you are wrongly thinking of yourself as righteous.
