SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

MAIN POINT

God's appointed king offers salvation and blessing to those who submit to his rule, or judgment and punishment to the nations, rulers and peoples who would rebel against it. Where King David and Israel failed to fulfill their mission to be God's conduit for salvation and blessing, Jesus came, conquered and was coronated as King. Salvation and blessing are offered to all peoples through the gospel of Jesus Christ.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What were your thoughts on the text/sermon? What most stood out? How was it helpful? Confusing?
2. Where do you struggle with a disconnect between knowing the truth of God's Word and feeling that truth in your heart?
3. Is there a specific truth, promise or command in Scripture that you could meditate on to help you in a specific trial you are facing in your life right now?
4. How can Psalm 2 and Acts 4:24-28 help shape the way you think about some current event happening locally, nationally or globally right now?
5. Where could your life reflect more of Jesus Christ so that others might see that your life is different and you are hoping in something different than they are?

AREAS OF APPLICATION

6. Meditate on a specific passage of Scripture to have your heart and mind shaped by God's Word.
7. Commit to fighting against grumbling and complaining about the latest political headlines or election outcomes. Commit to have your words and thoughts be like the Christians in Acts 4.
8. Commit to talking with others throughout your week about Jesus Christ instead of just news headlines or political situations.

PRAYER POINTS

9. Adoration. Praise God for revealing his grand drama of redemption through the pages of the Bible. Rejoice with trembling at his sovereign reign over all rulers and all nations and all peoples.
10. Confession. Confess ways you have put your time, emotions, thinking, and efforts in things other than the truth of God's Word. Confess where you have been more shaped and influenced by shallow things, rather than meditating on God's Word.
11. Thanksgiving. Thank God for the blessing and salvation that he offers all people through Jesus Christ.
12. Supplication. Pray that this good news would be carried to unreached peoples that have not heard the name of Jesus. Pray for Christians that are suffering under the rule of rebellious governments across the world. Pray for Christians in America to be marked by their love for Jesus and the truth of God's Word more than anything else. Ask for boldness to talk about Jesus with others.
