SERMON DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

MAIN POINT

The second chapter of Exodus shows God quietly and patiently working to prepare a servant fit for the service of Yahweh. By the end of the chapter, after Pharaoh died, "the people of Israel...cried out for help," and we see that God has been preparing his servant Moses the entire time to liberate His people from bondage in Egypt. In this, we are to see that God is always at work, anticipating our needs, even before we speak them.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What were your thoughts on the text/sermon? What most stood out? How was it helpful? Confusing?
- 2. How does your failure to remember God's faithfulness impact your life?
- 3. Do you view all the books of the Bible as one large story with application to your life?
- 4. Do you live as though God blesses obedience?
- 5. Do you see the theme of blessing through trial in other parts of Scripture?
- 6. Are you prepared to "count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus?" (Philippians 3:8)
- 7. Which character are you in Exodus 2?
- 8. In what way/s did the sermon help you see the greatness of God?

AREAS OF APPLICATION

- 9. Ask one godly person who knows you well to share an area in your life that you might not see very well.
- 10. Which character are you in Exodus 2? What sin(s) do you need to repent of?
- 11. Do you see God's patterns at work in your life?
- 12. Does seeing God's patterns in the Bible encourage you to obey God?
- 13. Read through the rest of Exodus.
- 14. Ask two different people in your family or DG (1) One thing they got from this sermon, and (2) How you can pray for them.
- 15. Ask God to show you one specific thing you ought to do differently as a result of this text or sermon? Share that and pray about it with someone in your DG. Continue praying for and checking in with each other until you've both done it.

PRAYER POINTS

- 16. Adoration. Praise God for being anticipating your greatest need-the forgiveness of sin..
- 17. Confess. Confess any areas of your life you have not surrendered to Christ.
- 18. Thanksgiving. Thank God that "while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." (Rom. 5:8)
- 19. Supplication. Ask God help you walk in obedience, knowing that He is with you.
